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**FOR ADULTS 50+**

Flublok Quadrivalent is a vaccine indicated for immunization against disease caused by influenza A and B strains contained in the vaccine. Flublok Quadrivalent is given to people 18 years of age and older.

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## THE RISK OF INFLUENZA IN ADULTS 50+

60% of adults aged 55-64 have at least one chronic health condition, and this number increases with age. These conditions may make adults 50+ particularly susceptible to influenza disease.

### ACCORDING TO THE CENTERS FOR DISEASE CONTROL AND PREVENTION (CDC):

In recent seasons,  
approximately 90% of INFLUENZA  
HOSPITALIZATIONS have occurred in adults  
with a known PRE-EXISTING CHRONIC  
HEALTH CONDITION.

Chronic conditions that increase the risk  
for flu complications include:

- **CARDIOVASCULAR DISEASE**
- **CHRONIC RESPIRATORY DISEASE**
- **DIABETES**

CDC estimated that in the particularly  
severe 2017-2018 flu season:

- **OVER 680,000 ADULTS 50+  
WERE HOSPITALIZED**
- **OVER 57,000 ADULTS 50+ DIED**

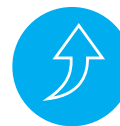
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## Flublok Quadrivalent: THE FLU VACCINE THAT IS PROVEN TO GIVE ADULTS 50+ MORE PROTECTION\*

\*In a clinical study of approximately 9000 people (about 4300 in each of the 2 groups), FLUBLOK QUADRIVALENT was proven to be 30% more effective at preventing flu in people 50+ than FLUARIX® QUADRIVALENT (INFLUENZA VACCINE).



Rates of side effects are similar compared to a standard-dose flu shot in adults 18-49 and 50+ years of age.



Formulated with 3x the standard-dose quadrivalent influenza vaccines.



The use or growth of the influenza virus is not required to manufacture Flublok Quadrivalent, which may help to ensure a better match to circulating strains recommended for inclusion in the vaccine by the FDA.

### SELECT IMPORTANT SAFETY INFORMATION

Tell your health care provider if you have ever had Guillain-Barré syndrome (severe muscle weakness) after a previous influenza vaccination.

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If Flublok Quadrivalent is given to people with a compromised immune system, including those receiving therapies that suppress the immune system, the immune response may be lower than expected.

Vaccination with Flublok Quadrivalent may not protect all people who receive the vaccine.

For Flublok Quadrivalent, in adults 18 through 49 years of age, the most common side effects were tenderness, and/or pain where you got the shot; headache, tiredness, muscle aches, and joint pain. In adults 50 years of age and older, the most common side effects were tenderness, and/or pain where you got the shot; headache, and tiredness. Other side effects may occur.

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
